

Waste/Recycling Guidelines

Recycling Guidelines

Recycling must be placed to the curb the night before or no later than 6:00am the scheduled day of pickup. Recycling must be loose in a 96 gallon cart or dumpster.

1. **Plastics:** Today two types are being recycled: PETE (#1 plastics) and HDPE (#2 plastics).

You will find plastic codes on the bottom or side of most plastic containers.



PETE #1 PETE

Polyethylene Terephthalate

Examples are soda bottles.



HDPE #2 HDPE

High Density Polyethylene

Examples are milk bottles.

Lids must be removed and **plastics should be clean and dry.** Labels do not need to be removed. **Plastic bags are not accepted.**



2. **Rigid Plastics:** Rigid plastics are accepted. Examples are buckets, milk crates, plastic toys, flowerpots, and lawn furniture.



3. **Glass: Green, brown and clear only.** All shapes and sizes are acceptable. **All glass containers should be clean, dry and without caps.**



4. **Aluminum Cans:** All aluminum beverage cans are acceptable. **All aluminum cans must be clean and dry. Aluminum cans are banned from disposal in your weekly garbage pickup. Recycle your cans. It's easy and it's the law!**



5. **Steel Cans:** All steel food and beverage cans are acceptable. Some examples are soup cans, fruit cans, vegetable cans, dog and cat food cans and juice cans. **All steel cans must be clean and dry!** Labels do not need to be removed.



6. **Cardboard:** Unwaxed and uncoated corrugated cardboard. Some examples are shipping cartons, furniture and equipment boxes. **Cardboard must be broken down flat, clean and dry.**



7. **Chipboard:** Boxes that are gray or brown in color on the inside. Some examples are cereal boxes, kleenex boxes, cracker boxes, etc



8. **Newspaper:** All newspaper and tabloids printed on newsprint. Some examples are daily newspapers, newspaper inserts and supermarket tabloids. **All newspaper must be clean and dry.**

10. **Magazines:** All types of magazines.



Items not accepted for recycling:

Trash bags, junk mail, glass dishes, mirrors, egg cartons, window panes, fast food cartons, meat trays, motor oil, jugs, or hazardous waste containers.

Items not accepted for trash container:

Pallets, paint, bulk items, liquid, batteries, light bulbs, anything hazardous, yard waste, oil filters etc.

Hazardous Waste: All hazardous waste must be taken to:
